



Coffee and refreshments

- eliminate disposables/use earth friendly coffee

- Use only shade grown coffee (this protects the rainforests)
- Use washable non-disposable dinnerware.
(Greco in Springfield sells bulk dinnerware sets)
- Use napkins of recycled content
- Offer a receptacle for compost friendly waste (plant based/coffee/tea)
- Keep large glass containers of water on hand in the refrigerator with reusable glasses nearby for drinking water.
(Please do not keep plastic bottled water onsite)
- Keep cloth dish towels in the kitchen for clean up. Set up a team for taking the used towels home to launder.
- Avoid serving beef as a dish.
(Cattle production severely impacts our global water supply, causes deforestation and methane gas emissions)

Janitorial Practices - Non-toxic, reusable materials

- Implement non-toxic cleaners, use washable towels for cleaning
(Many non-toxic cleaners are available that are effective)
- Place recycling containers throughout facility for paper, plastic, tin and aluminum
- Reduce use of paper towels
- Switch out all incandescent bulbs to CFLs
- Avoid changing out garbage can liners that are relatively clean

Office Practices - Reduce paper and recycle

- Switch to copy paper of recycled content
- Save single sided copies for reuse for future printing tasks
- Utilize email and website for communications for board and congregants as much as possible
- Utilize recycling services and free shredding services
- Encourage members to utilize the church website and email
- Keep the thermostat at 76 or above in summer and 72 in the winter.
- Get on the Do Not Mail List for direct mailings (greendimes.com)
- Purchase rechargeable batteries and a charger
- Teach copier users how to utilize discarded one sided copies

Lawn Practices - Non-toxic and Low water use

- Landscape to reduce water demand, consider rain barrel and rain garden use to reduce water demand
- Reduce use of pesticides and herbicides
- Invest in an electric lawn mower to reduce emissions if affordable

WHY GREEN YOUR WORSHIP PRACTICES?



1. **Saving paper—saves \$**
It takes a little time but once a system is developed, being careful and reusing blank sheets of paper can and encouraging copier users to do so as well can cut your paper use in by 50%.
2. **Switching to non-disposables saves the landfills, cuts emissions and reduces costs.**
Once a supply of reusable dinnerware is purchased and a dishwasher to run them through, there is no longer the need to make monthly purchases of dinnerware. It also takes water and energy to make disposable dinnerware products.
3. **Energy use reduction**
Switching to CFLs from incandescents and to T-5/T-8 fluorescents significantly cuts your energy bills.
4. **We are all connected**
As we reduce our impact we take care of one another.
